"A surprise wedding was solemnized at the Sherburn Gospel Tabernacle Sunday Sept. 8th at high noon when Earl G. Kendall of this village was united in marriage to Miss Olive L. Immediately after the closing prayer of the morning services, Mrs. Eva Uplinger started playing the wedding march to which strains the attendants, Vivian Kendall, sister of the groom, and Delbert Groshens, brother of the bride, marched slowly up the aisle, followed by the bride and groom. Rev. Dexter E. Collins, pastor of the Tabernacle, performed the circle ring ceremony, by which he united the young couple in marriage.

The bride wore an orchid georgette gown with a rose spray on the shoulder, while her attendant wore an orchid silk crepe dress. The groom wore a suit of conventional blue and his attendant a suit of brown.

The church was beautifully decorated in ferns and astors. Before the benediction was pronounced, the young couple marched out and disappeared before friends could congratulate them, leaving for an auto trip to the northern part of the state.

The groom is the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. E.S. Kendall of this village. He grew to young manhood here and attended the local schools. For the past eight years he has been employed with Fairmont Railway Motors at Fairmont. The bride came to this vicinity from Iowa about three years ago with her parents and lived for a time on the Triumph Stock farm, later moving to Sherburn where she had since made her home. During her stay at Sherburn she has won a large circle of friends by her pleasing personality.
